Also, "risk factors" that have been thought predispose those who divorce are explored. Having laid the groundwork, subsequent chapters cover the processes of the relationship estrangement that occurs within marriage, and various "causes" of divorce including legal definitions, psychological correlates, and marital complaints. The effect of divorce on physical and mental health and the implications of age and other life events on the ability to adjust are described. Parents' initial perceptions of the impact of divorce on their children are reported, as are changes in their perceptions over time. Other topics include economic factors, social support systems, and life after divorce. Finally, analyses are presented that illustrate what factors are associated with better and worse adjustment to divorce for blacks and whites, and men and women, both cross-sectionally and longitudinally. Adding immeasurably to our understanding about the causes and consequences of divorce, this volume will be valued by clinicians who work with the divorced, community psychologists, child and family development scholars, and and sociologists interested in family and health. WHAT THE BIBLE SAYS ABOUT DIVORCE, REMARRIAGE AND MINISTRY

The church once spoke with unanimity on the subject of divorce, remarriage, and ministry. All divorce was sin, remarriage was always wrong, and the divorced were excluded not only from all forms of ministry but too often from the fellowship of the church as well. But the breakdown of the home has forced churches to confront the issue again and ask whether our traditional understanding actually reflects the biblical teaching. Pastor Dave Miller has been studying this issue since a seminary assignment forced him to delve into the topic. That research paper became a Bible study for his churches and eventually a series of active blogposts at SBC Voices, where he is the editor. This book is the result of that study. He believes that the traditional view does not accurately reflect the biblical truth on the subject. He views the Bible's teaching as a progressive but unified revelation of God's will about marriage and divorce. The book begins by examining the two truths that set the cornerstone for the Scriptural revelation on the subject. God intended marriage to be a lifelong covenant between a man and a woman. But sin broke the ideal God intended. The

"hardness of man's heart" led to the breaking of that covenant. In Deuteronomy 24:1-4, Moses laid the foundation on that cornerstone, establishing that divorce required moral grounds instead of being simply at the whim of capricious men. Jesus built the structure, reemphasizing the intent of God for marriage to be permanent and sacred, but also granting an exception on the basis of adultery. Paul put the finishing touches on the structure in 1 Corinthians 7, adding a second exception for abandonment and other specific teachings. He also explores the question about how the church should handle abuse and whether abuse justifies divorce. After developing this full revelation of biblical truth on divorce and remarriage, the book turns to church issues, addressing the controversial topic of whether divorced men are eligible to serve as pastors, elders, or deacons in the church. Beginning with a study of the phrase "husband of one wife" in 1 Timothy 3 and Titus 1, Pastor Miller explores tough questions the church needs to address. He then gives specific advice both to those who are divorced and frustrated at their place in the church and to the church as to how it should minister to the divorced and deal with these issues. There is no way we can avoid this discussion, and this book's intent is to engage the issue and inspire the church not only to talk about the issue but more importantly to delve into God's word and seek to understand what the Bible actually says about divorce, remarriage, and ministry.

RENEGOTIATING FAMILY RELATIONSHIPS

Ways to balance loyalties and alliances in the parent-child-parent triad are also discussed. Divorce and custody law and the implications they have for mediation are examined, with sections discussing such issues as financial settlements, property division, alimony, child support, taxes, remarriage, and post-divorce economics for single mothers. Theories of custody dispute resolution and tactics for bargaining and settling disputes are also presented, as are methods for negotiating agreements, including ways to determine settlement policies, and conduct mediation sessions with parents. Offering strategies for working with attorneys and judges, the book describes how to define problems; set up caucuses; focus on issues instead of emotions; and review areas of agreement and disagreement. Later chapters focus on custody mediation research and psychological research on children, parents, and divorce with an examination of precedent-setting mediation cases, issues of compliance, demographics of divorce, and how both children and parents adjust to the divorce process in light of changes in the family structure. Finally, the future of custody mediation is also discussed. You will find, however, that the college or university library is more complex and often larger than the library with which you may be familiar. It probably provides a greater variety of services, and it may use a different scheme for classifying its materials. Over the last two decades technology has drastically changed the way we think of libraries. For many, the traditional notion of libraries as storehouses for books has been replaced by the image of a virtual library—that is, a library in which all the information is available electronically. In this image, if a building exists at all it is only to house computers and to provide a laboratory in which librarians, acting as information specialists, are engaged in creating information in digital format. Neither the traditional notion of a library as a storehouse for books nor the image of a virtual library is entirely true today. However, there is a certain amount of validity in each of these images. The library you are using probably no longer

has a card catalog. In most academic libraries the card catalog has been replaced by an online catalog. Many libraries have canceled paper subscriptions to indexes and abstracts, replacing them with electronic versions. Although libraries have gotten rid of their card catalogs in favor of online catalogs and subscribe to online databases and other resources in electronic format, they continue to retain and purchase materials in traditional formats: paper, microfiche, microfilm, video cassette, and the like. And while it is true that technology has improved the ways we retrieve information, it has also added levels of complexity. College and university libraries offer a variety of
