The trials show how the yield gap between organic and conventional crops was closed over 3 years. Human Sciences Research Council Student attrition has been a perennial theme in South African higher education throughout the decade. In its National Plan for Higher Education (2001), the Department of Education attributed high dropout rates primarily to financial and/or academic exclusions.
